

	Questions from Residents	Cornerstone Responses
1	Will there be a fence around the property?	Yes, there will be a security fence around the plant, along with a full-time security monitoring system.
2	Will baseline be adopted by Jackson County?	Rives Township and Jackson County will have no requirement or obligation to adopt Baseline Rd.
3	Will the township pay to have this paved (Baseline Rd)?	Rives Township will have no requirement or obligation to pave Baseline Road.
4	Where will pipeline to the Grand River run?	The small discharge pipeline plans to follow the existing right-of-ways to the discharge point.
5	Will neighbors get free natural gas?	The local utility would need to supply natural gas to the residents. Cornerstone Energy Center is not permitted for retail supply.
6	How many plants do you operate now?	NOVI Energy is a development company that is developing Cornerstone Energy Center. NOVI Energy does not operate plants. Cornerstone Energy Center will contract with qualified and experienced operators that have a long track record of successfully operating similar plants.
7	Have you had to close or deactivate any plants? Why?	No. See below.
8	Have you had to file for bankruptcy protection on any of your projects?	No.
9	Have you had any complaints from the State of Michigan for environmental violations?	No. NOVI Energy and Cornerstone Energy Center have not had any complaints for environmental violations. See below.
10	Do you have any open law suits pending against you for any of your plants? Who brought the suits and why?	None.

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11	What is the expected water use from ACC?	The plant will be an air-cooled facility which will minimize water requirements. The average water requirements for one unit is estimated to be approximately 65 gpm.
12	What will happen to wildlife and hunting on the property?	Impacts to wildlife will be minimal. Hunting will not be allowed on the property.
13	What will be the general footprint/layout of the proposed facility?	Please see the site map in the information released by Cornerstone Energy Center.
14	Will trees need to be cut down?	We value the trees on the plant site and will take steps to minimize impact on trees. The existing trees provide a natural visual and noise buffer.
15	The pipeline ROW will not allow trees. What will you do about that?	Cornerstone Energy Center will work with the pipeline and the electrical power line right-of-way owners to ensure we comply with their requirements.

Fremont Community Digester related clarifications

NOVI Energy was the developer for Fremont Community Digester plant. Fremont Community Digester is a waste to energy plant and processes organic wastes and agricultural wastes into bio-gas which is used to generate electricity, liquid fertilizer and compost. That plant was built and operated for two years.

Fremont Community Digester had a dispute with its construction contractor and temporarily stopped operations. The plant has since been sold to a third party who is operating the plant. The dispute with the construction contractor was resolved as part of the sale.

There was a complaint received in connection with the Fremont Community Digester plant. The liquid fertilizer produced at the plant was permitted for land application under certain conditions. A Violation Notice was received by Fremont Community Digester when the fertilizer was applied on land incorrectly. Fremont Community Digester stopped the land application immediately, remedied the affected land, and the violation was resolved.
